

Dear RPS Families,

Term 3 finishes tomorrow afternoon. I want to thank our students, staff and families for a wonderful term of learning. A reminder that the first Monday back next term is a pupil free day. We look forward to welcoming back our students on Tuesday 15 October.

This week nine of our year 6 students attended Calwell High School for their first transition visit in preparation for high school. The students were given a tour of their new school and met several staff including Mr. Ricky, the therapy dog. The students were involved in several activities including a memory game, a song artist challenge, and the smarty and chopstick game. These were run by the Year 9 student mentors. There are several other visits and events scheduled in term 4. Matt Bradley the Year 7 coordinator will inform families via email when they are occurring.

One of the signs of early spring for the Ngunnawal people is seeing the early wattle bloom.

Another sign of spring is the magpies making their nests, so we made our own magpie nests with clay, sticks and pine needles for the grass. Of course, first we had to pretend to be magpies so we went outside to collect our sticks and other pieces for our nests.


